TOPIC: Home Fire Escape Planner

Why this activity? Activity: In a fire you have as little as 2 minutes to escape. Seeing an evacuation plan daily can reduce panic and improve reaction time. This activity helps parents to have a visual to plan and practice in case of an emergency.

What we need:

- graph paper or construction paper
- Pen-pencil, markers or crayons
- Stickers (optional)

- Ruler

How we do it?

- Use the graph paper or construction paper.
- Have parents to draw on the large piece of paper the layout of their home or apartment.
- Parents will label each area in their home/apartment.
- Parents will circle or add a sticker where the fire extinguisher, fire extinguisher, smoke alarm, and carbon monoxide detector are located.
- Parents will write exit on each way out of the home. They will label them as primary escape and/or secondary escape.
- Parent will assign the safe meeting place.
- Once project is done, they will share it with Home Visitor.

Tip: Keep your plan in a high traffic area like the fridge, bedrooms, or near the front door for daily reinforcement. Be Creative!

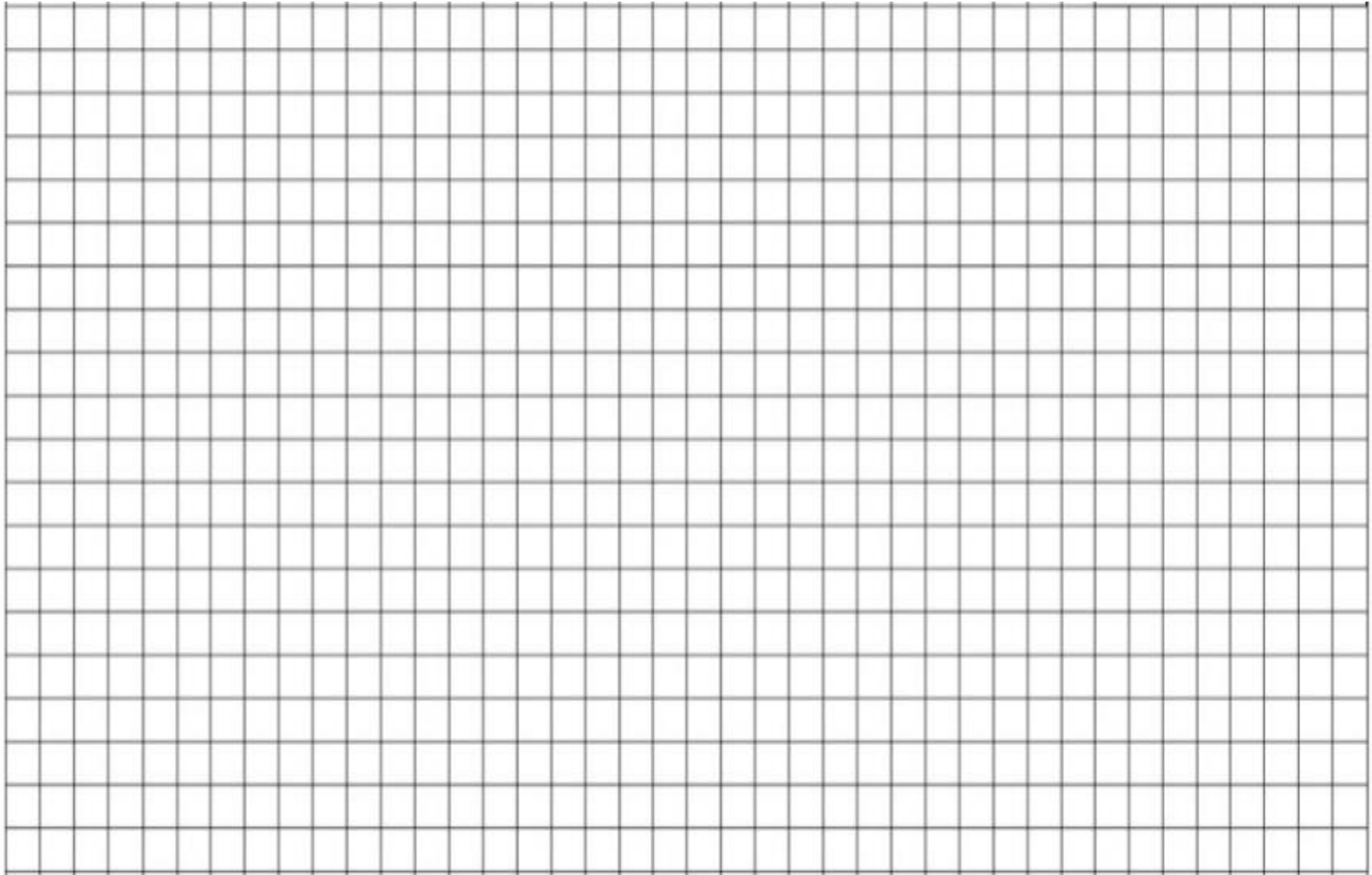
